GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

Funds are available to recruit and retain medical practitioners.

The recipient must be a Vermont resident and a primary care nurse practitioner, physician assistant, psychiatric nurse practitioner, certified nurse midwife, or physician (MD, DO, ND). Specialties include family medicine, general internal medicine/adult primary care, pediatrics, obstetrics/gynecology, geriatrics, and psychiatry. Must practice a minimum average of 20 (clinical) hours per week and 45 weeks per year in Vermont.

Eligible work sites are primary care practices (ambulatory/outpatient), urgent care sites, outpatient mental health/substance use disorder settings, inpatient mental health settings, a free health care clinic in Vermont.

The practice site or region must be a healthcare workforce shortage area, as defined by the Program.

Employer matching funds are encouraged, but not required.

Recipient must sign a service obligation contract (typically 12-to-24-month commitment).

Grants go directly to pay educational loans.
