

# 2026 Vermont AHEC Paid Summer Project

## **Position Description: Instructor for the Governor's Institute on Health & Medicine**

With Northern Vermont Area Health Education Center

Led by Nicole LaPointe, EdD, MSW, Executive Director

## **Eligible Applicants**

Northern Vermont AHEC is seeking graduate students in health-related programs of study with an interest in teaching and mentorship to be part of an interprofessional instructor team working with high school students during the Governor's Health & Medicine Institute being held on the University of Vermont campus from Sunday, July 12 through Saturday July 18.

## **Commitment**

This project includes an AHEC Scholars training Leading Learning Teams (40 hours of virtual, in-person, and independent learning) and 60 hours of field work as an instructor at the Governor's Health & Medicine Institute. The total commitment is 100 hours. See important project dates below.

## **Compensation**

Instructors will be paid \$2,000 at the start of the project.

## **Expectations for Field Experience**

Instructors at the Health & Medicine Institute work as part of an interprofessional team to teach, demonstrate, role model, and advise high-school-aged youth on key concepts in health science, clinical care, professionalism, and career pathway planning. Instructors commit to participating in person at the Health & Medicine Institute for the full week. Lunch is provided to staff daily.

Instructors are responsible for designing, leading, and assisting with set-up and break-down of educational activities between the hours of 7:30 am – 5:30 pm while the Institute is in session. Additional time outside of instruction hours may be required for planning activities during the week. Instructors will create their own active and hands-on learning modules for students inspired by the topics in health and medicine that ignite their passion. Northern Vermont AHEC staff will work with Instructors to develop their ideas into interactive workshops and provide lesson plans to use as-is or adapt. Instructors may be invited to participate in evening activities with Health & Medicine participants and may elect to do so at their own discretion.
